	Homework Activities	Date completed
1	Create your own rival for 'The Iron Man'. You could make it 3D or 2D.	
2	Make a world for Iron Man to live on. Think of what he needs to stay alive and be entertained.	
3	Iron Man has broken! Can you create a machine that would get him back together? Think about the materials you would use and how you would do it.	
4	Pretend that you are the one who found The Iron Man. Write a diary of the things that you did with him.	
5	Create a fact file about Iron Man. Include facts about where he lives, what he eats, his size etc.	
6	Create your own Iron Man board game. Maybe you could lose points when the army attacks but you win points when you find Iron Man's hand on the beach.	
7	Create your own Iron Man shadows outside or with a torch. How long/short can you make them? Can you measure them?	
8	Create your own shadow puppet and include them in a play. You could record your play or take photographs.	

Maths

Please practice the 3, 4 and 8 times tables every week with your child. The children should be able to:

Say the tables in order - $1 \times 3 = 3$, $2 \times 2 = 4$ etc

Answer quickly out of order - "What is 3×4 ?" "What is 3×9 ?"

Know the inverse number sentence - $5 \times 8 = 40$ inverse $40 \div 8 = 5$

Furthermore a piece of maths homework may be sent out to support their learning in school, this will only be if they need it.

Spelling

Children will receive their weekly spellings on a Monday. Keep these at home until Friday so your child can practice them ready for their Friday spelling test.

Reading

And don't forget to help your child earn their reading stars by reading with them 3 times a week and writing in their reading record book.
