	Homework Activities	Date completed
1	Create cave art using different techniques and materials. E.g. chalk, paint. Can your pictures tell a story?	
2	Design a tool and explain why a man living in the stone age would find it useful. Why did you choose those materials? How would they use it?	
3	Create a diary for a day in the life of a stone age man or woman. Think about how different it would be to your life now.	
4	Create your own model/ 3D creation of an Egyptian relic using different materials. E.g. pyramid, sphynx, sarcophagus	
5	Research the Egyptian Gods. Create a poster all about your favourite God, including information and facts.	
6	Create a mask of an Egyptian God or pharaoh.	
7	Choreograph your own Egyptian dance. You could take photos or video your moves!	

Maths

Please practice the 3, 4 and 8 times tables every week with your child. The children should be able to:

Say the tables in order - $1 \times 3 = 3$, $2 \times 2 = 4$ etc

Answer quickly out of order - "What is 3×4 ?" "What is 3×9 ?"

Furthermore a piece of maths homework may be sent out to support their learning in school, this will only be if they need it.

Spelling

Children will receive their weekly spellings on a Friday and they will be tested the following Friday.

Reading

Don't forget to help your child earn their reading stars by reading with them 3 times a week and writing in their reading record book. An additional task e.g. comprehension will be sent home each week in addition. Your child will need to complete this in order to get their reading star.
